### **Messy Church**

Messy Church has started again after a 4 week break during August and our numbers have held up well with approximately 100 children and adults coming to Church.

Thank you to all of you that continue to help and to those who have recently signed up on the rota that Kathleen Wharton has kindly put together for us: we are grateful to her for that.

- One area that we still need help in is also a significant and key aspect to the long term success of Messy Church. This key area is building relationships and we do that by befriending those that come along. We have 8 tables set out in the church and ideally we need someone from the church at each table. Conversation is easy. The parents and children are really friendly and you'll probably join in with one of the craft activities which is always a conversation starter. You can also help any children that might need help with the craft. Simply put be yourself. So please come along and see what it is all about.

### **The Discovery Zone (DZ)**

The Discovery Zone is a service/worship Café style. It is relaxed and for all ages. Breakfast is from 9am, which is followed by a time of worship that includes modern songs and film clips to illustrate the theme for the morning. It is very suitable for non-church goers, as well as those who like contemporary worship. Please pass the word around that it is held monthly on the last Sunday of each month and why not invite a friend to it. If you are not sure, come along and see for yourself. We'll make you very welcome.

On the night you can be a passive listener and take it all in or you can ask questions of your own. It's a warm friendly group and you are all welcome.

We'll finish the evening with some enjoyable Chinese food. We don't charge, but we do ask for donations so that the food cost is covered.

### **Who let the dads out?**

In January 2013 we will finally launch 'Who let the dads out?' Dads often get a bad press and I think society doesn't value them as much as they should. With family breakdown too, it can be difficult for dads in maintaining family ties. It will be monthly and will be for dads, stepdads, granddads and male carers. This is an extract regarding what it's all about:

*'We know that parent and toddler work can transform relationships and strengthen families. Yet we also know that mostly mothers have populated the parent and toddler world.'*

*Who Let The Dads Out? is all about creating space where dads and their young children can have fun together and is founded on the Christian principle of wanting to demonstrate God's love to communities.*

*Who Let The Dads Out? toddler sessions are specifically for toddlers and their dads, stepdads, granddads and male carers. They follow the same traditional format as normal parent and toddler sessions. There are toys, craft activities, stories and, if you're brave, even song time, but with a few masculine touches, such as bacon butties and newspapers. It can also help mum get a break.'*

We are facilitating men to have a good time with their children in a safe environment – we are not running any childcare.

- I'm looking for men to help with running the sessions which will be just once a month on a Saturday morning for a couple of hours. It should be fun and nothing too onerous. Please speak with Roger.

### **Tuesday Extra Group (name to be decided soon)**

On the alternate Tuesdays in between Messy Church, a new group at the same time that Messy Church runs will start and it is hoped that this will start on Tuesday 15<sup>th</sup> January. This new group will allow those that come to Messy Church to explore more about the Christian faith and ask the questions that arise from Messy Church themes. We think that the numbers that will come will be **significantly less** than those attending Messy Church. Parents and carers will still come with the children, but it is planned that we will provide the child care while the parents as far as practicable will be able to 'explore' in relative peace. Hopefully we'll be able to provide a snack/sandwich tea too.

The help that we will need is:

- Looking after the children who'll be watching suitable DVDs, playing some games and colouring
- Making some sandwiches and putting together some snack type food for tea
- Making tea and coffee/refreshments as the people arrive.

If you can help or would like to be involved in this we'd appreciate your help/input very much. Please speak with Roger.

### **11Up/11Up+**

At the moment we are joining with the Peak Circuit over at Castleton where the Passion4Life course is being run. This course introduces the fundamentals of Christian living and the Christian faith.

We are also on a monthly basis travelling over to Hathersage for Teen Spirit on a Sunday evening – this is a time of reflection and worship.

In November we are having a full day at the Methodist Youth Conference called 3Generate. It's exciting that this will be our third year at the event and that this year it is a complete sell out with around 300 young people in attendance.

## **Organ Bursary Fund awards announced.**

Churches Together in Buxton is delighted to announce that two awards are being made from the Organ Bursary Fund. Katy Beale from Great Longstone has been awarded the Golsoncott Award, while the Bingham Award goes to Charlotte Jardine from Bakewell. The awards are named after two Trusts that have made substantial contributions to the Organ Bursary Fund; these donations, along with generous gifts from individuals in Buxton and elsewhere, have enabled the Bursary Committee to go ahead and launch the scheme.

Katy and Charlotte are students at Lady Manners School and participate fully in the range of musical activity on offer there. They are also involved in music outside school and both performed in this year's Buxton Music Festival. Katy started piano lessons when she was just 7 years old and her fluent and assured playing impressed the panel at the audition. She has just completed her GCSE exams and starts A level courses at Lady Manners School in September. Charlotte's musical education started at a similar age when she took up the violin. She did not take up the piano until she was 12 years old and in under three years she has made remarkable progress with her keyboard skills. Charlotte is due to complete her GCSE course next year.

Both girls are planning to start organ lessons with Andrew Cummings FRCO in the autumn term. In the first instance, the awards are for one year, but the Committee will be working hard to ensure that there are funds available to extend the awards beyond the first year. As well as Katy and Charlotte, there are several promising younger candidates who have expressed an interest in auditioning for the scheme in future. ## **Some light in the gloom.....**

Buxton Methodist Church's annual accounts may not be as eagerly awaited as those of Marks & Spencer, but then it seems that the high street gloom has not had as great an impact on our financial performance as might have been anticipated. The church's 'year-end' is 31 August and early indications are that overall we spent £27,000 less in the last twelve months up to September than we received in income in the same period! As always, the annual accounts present a 'snap-shot' in time and there are some anomalies that must be explained. The annual income of £165,000 includes two years' gift aid tax relief, as approximately £10,000 relating to 2010-11 had not been received before the end of that financial year. It also includes the funds raised at our very successful Gift Day and some generous donations, as well as grants received towards the work of our lay worker. We have much to celebrate and for which to be thankful. Our expenditure too, however, has had some unexpected items, most particularly the new photocopier. And we are pleased to see that expenditure on young people's activities has increased, as Roger Mallard's work has developed.

The Church Council will receive the examined final accounts and annual report at its meeting in February 2013, together with an updated five year forecast and budget. The finance committee, recognising that costs of fuel, stationery and consumables continue to rise and that we must acknowledge the hard work of our staff and pay them appropriately in line with Methodist Church national guidance on the 'living wage', is expecting to increase the expenditure budget for 2012-13 by 4%, and also take into account some property items for which payment has slipped into this financial year.

We understand that many people and organisations are struggling in these harsh economic times. Our room bookings are slightly down, as some previously regular hirers are no longer in operation, but we are doing as well as the current market will allow. The café team is to be congratulated on managing to maintain income levels (and providing good value refreshment with fellowship). It is difficult to ask church

members to dig yet deeper into ever shallower pockets, but if you can, please review your annual giving and try to add 4% or so to your Bank mandate, weekly envelope or other free will giving. And if you are a tax payer, your Gift Aid declaration will mean the taxman will add 4% more rebate too.

A huge amount of work goes on behind the scenes to maintain our premises so that they can be used for community benefit and to sustain our work, and in administration to handle our lettings, pay the bills and manage our finances. We give heartfelt thanks to our Treasurer, Ian Stubbs, to the office staff, caretakers, property and finance committee members and all the volunteers who work so hard to keep that high street gloom away from our church so that we can show Christ's light in a world of darkness.
