ADVENT: A SUSTAINABLE CHRISTMAS

More tips to make your Christmas kinder to the environment:

Make your own decorations

Those of us with primary school-age children or grandchildren will be familiar already with the idea of homemade decorations. But handmade isn't the exclusive reserve of the under 11s. I've still not made our door wreath; that's on my list for this week. There are lots of natural decorations you can make with offcuts from the garden. You could make table decorations by filling small jars, glasses or pretty dishes with pinecones, nuts, berries or arrangements. Little sprigs of hardy herbs

or berries/rosehips look great tied around the necks of jars and bottles of homemade jams, drinks or sweets. You can even use plants as cake decorations, though best to avoid poisonous species! Go on. Have a go. You might well surprise yourself.



Reconsider Christmas Crackers

Christmas crackers are a fun tradition, but ask yourself: do you really need a small plastic toy? And will you just be tossing them into the bin at the end of the day? Many elements from Christmas crackers are non-recyclable or just downright wasteful (and useless), but if you don't want to eliminate them altogether, why not opt for more eco-friendly versions such as reusable or recyclable ones? You could

even get creative and make your own DIY crackers with toilet roll tubes and old wrapping paper. You can buy the snappers to give them an authentic 'bang' and include whatever you like inside them – bad dad jokes, handmade paper hats and little edible treats usually go down well in our house.

I realise I'm preaching to the converted, but I hope you can see that there are many ways – simple yet effective – in which you can have a more sustainable Christmas.
